Each year the school receives a PE and Sport Grant from the Government.

At Abbots Green we support all our pupils and aim to use this money to improve the quality of the PE and Sport activity we offer to our pupils. PE and sport is very important to us at Abbots Green Primary and we pride ourselves on promoting physical activity, both within our PE lessons and during lunchtime and afterschool activities.

The PE and School Sport premium from the government has been greatly received and we plan to use the funds wisely to foster the children's lifelong love of sport. Within school we have an action plan outlining how we wish to use the money, baseline data we are collecting and evidence to show the positive impact of this funding.

<p>The funding received from PE and Sport funding has enabled us to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Continue to be a member of the Bury School Sport Partnership which has involved participation in intra-school competitions locally, both virtual and in person.• Provide an offer of extra-curricular sports activities- Multisports club, Running club, Dodgeball, Ninja Warrior, Bike Ability, Gymnastics, Football.• To ensure that children have access to appropriate equipment needed for PE curriculum.• Further embed the use 'Scrapstore Playpod' as a valuable lunchtime activity across the school.• Further embed the PE curriculum and enrich this with a Dance project in Y4.• To continue to utilise Commando Joe within the PE curriculum.• Develop cross curricular links, including PSHE & well-being, to ensure all children are 'healthy'.• Use physical activity to support specific children in the classroom.• To elect and train Abbots Green Sports Leaders to safely facilitate a range of games and activities at lunchtimes.• To complete the installation of the daily mile track on the field.• To launch the use of Moki bands to encourage increased activity during the school day in all year groups.• To ensure that as many children as possible leaving Abbots Green are able to swim 25m.

<p><i>The funding has allowed us to see an improved sporting performance, increased participation and better promotion of health and well-being.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The daily mile track has ensured that for 15 minutes of the day an outside activity can take place in almost any weather, helping with the fitness of all our children.• Scrapstore has encouraged children (including those who are less active) to be physically active at lunchtimes, as well as supporting them to develop socially using their gross motors skills to build, invent and play collaboratively.

- The Moki bands have provided healthy competition between classes and encouraged children to become more active, but also used as a tool in measuring fitness in all year groups.
- Extra-curricular clubs have been implemented to provide opportunities for all children to try some new sports and to extend their 'active day'.
