The Changemakers



At Abbots Green we have a steering body called the Changemakers.


There is one Changemaker in every year group from Year 1 to 6, and their job is to ensure that the rights of the child are explored and taught in school. Each Changemaker collects a piece of work that they have linked to one of the UNICEF articles each week during learning time. They collate this evidence in their UNICEF folder.

They are also set a range of different tasks each fortnight to explore with their year groups on the current Article of the week.



<u>Learning about our rights</u>

Children and young people at Abbots Green are familiar with a number of Articles and can talk about the rights they enjoy. They know that rights are unconditional and universal. They demonstrate an awareness of where and why some children may not be able to access their rights. Adults and the wider community know about and understand the Conventions of the Rights of the Child.



Every year group's long term plan contains a section where they link their curriculum to articles of the CRC.

This ensures in all subjects there are opportunities to explore childrens' rights.

Abbots Green Academy is an inclusive school. Activities will be adapted to meet the needs of individual pupils to




As a school, we also have our own 'Jolly News'

Our Whole School Charter



At our school, we have a whole school charter. We created a video with the steering body which explained the charter and what this means for them at school. Then every pupil at Abbots Green signed the charter to show their commitment and understanding of the CRC.





Relationships at Abbots Green







In order to be a Rights Respecting School, relationships need to be positive and founded on dignity and a mutual respect for rights. At Abbots Green many children and young people speak with confidence about how positive relationships are encouraged. We help the students to use their rainbow values. Every week, one member of each class is awarded a certificate for displaying in their learning, one of the rainbow values. At Abbots Green, every class takes part in a PSHE lesson every week using the JIGSAW scheme. This scheme explores the theme of healthy relationships and helps the children to clarify moral dilemmas. Our citizenship award recognises pupils at our school who respect the rights of a child and possess many of our rainbow values.



Finding our individuality

From being a rights respecting school, we can feel secure knowing that our children feel included and valued as individuals. Children at Abbots Green can describe how they are included at school and how their actions contribute to this. Children are given roles and responsibilities at our school such as being a member of Tuck club or Safety Squad. Our whole school vision promotes individuality and this is a focus in many of our whole school assemblies too.
